

Prayer at St Aidan's

The Lord teaches us much about prayer and encourages us to pray for one another. Here at St Aidan's there are a number of ways that this prayer occurs. The below details some of those ways and I would encourage you to engage with this prayer and indeed to "... pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people," (Eph. 6: 18).

Prayers of the People

Each week you will see prayers in our bulletin that link to the Service and the Anglican Cycle of Prayer. They can be used in the week on a personal basis. You will also see names listed for prayer. If you wish for an individual to be prayed for in this way their name needs to be given to Candace in our office, Margaret Friesen or Betty Ann Hossack (the names will be regularly rotated in the weekly Bulletin to ensure all are prayed for in our Services).

Corporate Prayer Group

A Group of individuals meet once a week to pray for more confidential matters, for the Church in general and for those on the prayer list. For information or to place a prayer request please speak with Betty Ann Hossack.

The Prayer Chain
