A Gospel Shaped Church (Review)

What are the five "Solas" of the Protestant Reformation?
Describe the Good News of the Gospel using all five of the <i>Solas</i> .
"Soli Deo Gloria" – Glory to God Alone
What is the purpose of our creation, our redemption, and God's New Creation in Christ? How does the theme of God's glory tie together the whole story of Scripture?
How is Soli Deo Gloria related to the first four Solas that we have considered?
What does Scripture mean when it says that God is jealous for us? Why does God demand the undivided worship of his people?
What is the overarching biblical theme that the five <i>Solas</i> emphasize? Does this challenge your understanding of the Gospel message or of how we are saved? If so, what questions do you need to follow up on?

What does it mean for us to glorify God? How do we glorify God?
How does the Gospel shape and change our affections for God?
How does the Gospel shape and change our obedience to God?
What kind of obedience gives God the most glory and why is this the case?
How did Jesus bring glory to the Father in his time on earth?
In your own words, what is the Church? How does the Apostle Peter describe the Church? According to Peter, what is the purpose and mission of the Church?
How has God personally challenged you in and through this sermon series? What is God calling us to do as a Church as a result of the teaching in this sermon series? What questions will you take away from this sermon series for further study?
