## The Invitatory

Then follows one of the Invitatory psalms, or the Easter canticle, or a suitable hymn.

One of the following antiphons may be said or sung before and after the Invitatory psalm (and between the sections of the psalm, if desired).

1 God rules over all the earth: O come, let us worship.

2 The Lord is in his holy temple: O come, let us worship.

3 The Lord is our refuge and strength: O come, let us worship.

4 The Lord is our light and our life: O come, let us worship.

#### **Easter**

10 Alleluia! The Lord is risen indeed: O come, let us worship.

### **Jubilate**

Psalm 100

Be joyful in the Lord, all you lands; \*

serve the Lord with gladness

and come before his presence with a song.

Know this: The Lord himself is God; \*

he himself has made us, and we are his;

we are his people and the sheep of his pasture.

Enter his gates with thanksgiving;

go into his courts with praise; \*

give thanks to him and call upon his name.

his mercy is everlasting; \*

and his faithfulness endures from age to age.

The following may be sung or said from Easter until Pentecost. **Christ our Passover** (page 50)

1 Corinthians 5.7–8; Romans 6.9–11; 1 Corinthians 15.20–22 Alleluia!

Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us; \* therefore let us keep the feast,
Not with the old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil, \* but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

Alleluia!

Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; \* death no longer has dominion over him.

The death that he died, he died to sin, once for all; \* but the life he lives, he lives to God.

So also consider yourselves dead to sin, \* and alive to God in Jesus Christ our Lord. Alleluia!

Christ has been raised from the dead, \*
the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.
For since by a man came death, \*
by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead.
For as in Adam all die, \*
so also in Christ shall all be made alive. Alleluia!

101 I restrain my feet from every evil way, \* that I may keep your word.

102 I do not shrink from your judgements, \* because you yourself have taught me.

That in the undying love of Christ we may be united with all who have died in the faith of Christ: we remember those that we have loved and lost, those that face death now and those whose anniversaries of death occur at this time. We thank you that you will bring us to fullness of unity, together under Christ. Lord in your mercy, **Hear our prayer** 

Let us commend the world, in which Christ rose from the dead, to the mercy and protection of God.

We bring these prayers together in today's collect and the Lord's prayer:

### The Collect

God our redeemer, you have delivered us from the power of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of your Son: grant, that as by His death He has recalled us to life, so by His continual presence in us He may raise us to eternal joy; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit ne God, now and forever. Amen.

### The Lord's Prayer (page 54)

Gathering our prayers and praises into one, let us pray as our Saviour taught us,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
