Twenty Things to Notice

Themes

Main ideas that are repeated throughout the book 2Thess – Suffering, Second Coming

Repeated Words/Ideas

Only repeated in certain portions of a book Gal – grace, law, faith

People

Main characters, people, people groups, author, audience

Titus 1:10-12 - Circumcision Party, Cretans

Locations

Geographic locations found on a map or general references to location

Eph 2:6 "...and made us sit with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus ..."

Events

Significant events recorded or referred to by the author 15am. 13:1-19:8 – Absalom usurps David's throne

Time References

Before, after, during, while, then, until, when, etc. Eph 1:4 "...he chose us in him <u>before</u> the foundation of the world..."

Contrasts

Can be identified by the word "but" or seen in broader contrasts of ideas, people, events, etc.

Philemon v14 "...not by compulsion but of your own free will"

Comparisons

Often introduced by the words "like" or "as" but can also be seen in the broader comparison of ideas, people, events, etc.

Philemon 17 "receive him as you would receive me."

Conditional Statements

"If ... then ..."

Gal 6:3 "For <u>if</u> any one thinks he is something, when he is nothing, he deceives himself."

Connectives

Reflect reasons, results and conclusions

Therefore, yet, however, likewise, so then, nevertheless, so that, because, for, etc.

Phil 2:8-9 "and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him."

Commands

Instructions to follow

Phil 2:14 "Do all things without grumbling or questioning"

Promises

Statements of hope

John 4:14 "...but whoever drinks of the water I give him will never thirst..."

Warnings

Caution offered by the author

Phil 3:2 "Beware of the dogs, beware of the evil workers ..."

Predictions

Anticipates a future event

Mark 13:26 "And then they will see the Son of man coming in the clouds ..."

Questions and Answers

Could be a rhetorical question or a question asked by the author or audience. May or may not be followed by an answer

Gal 3:19 "Why then the law?" followed by the answer.

Illustrations

Illustrations from scripture, everyday life situations or the personal experience of the author or audience *Prov 6:6-8 – Ants*

Quotes/Allusions

Old Testament or Extra-biblical direct quotes or allusions Gal 3:6 "Thus Abraham 'believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness'"

Emphatic Statements

A strong statement emphasized in some way Mark 12:43 "Truly, I say to you..."

Lists

A list of three or more things
Gal 5:22-23 "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, ..."

Emotion/Atmosphere/Mood

Gentle, joyful, angry, rebuking, etc. *Gal 3:1 "O foolish Galatians!"*
